he Chargée d'Affaires, a.i., Audrey Rivera Gómez attended the welcome reception for the Brazilian Ambassador, Mr. Nelson Antonio Tabajara De Oliveira on February 14. In this context, she spoke with the David Josefsson, Member of Parliament of the Moderate party from Gothenburg and President of the Brazil-Sweden Parliamentarians Association, who recognized the leadership of Mexico and Brazil in Latin America. She also spoke with Robert Eirfjell, Director of Cashless Society, which developed the Swish program, a mobile payment system in Sweden launched by six large Swedish banks in cooperation with the Central Bank of Sweden. In September 2018 it had 6.5 million users. Swish has been downloaded by more than half of the Swedish population, and according to him this program could be useful in Mexico, and expressed his interest in talking with Mexican financiers about the benefits of a cashless society.

he Chargée d'Affaires, a.i., Dr. Audrey Rivera Gómez attended, on February 27, the invitation made by the Ambassador of the Dominican Republic to Sweden, Mrs. Laura Faxas, on the occasion of the commemoration of the National Day. In this context, Ambassador Faxas during her speech highlighted that the Dominican Republic has some of the most important economic growth in Latin America and that during the last two decades, their annual growth averaged 5.3%. In 2018, the economy reached a growth of 6.7%, "due to the expansion of the tourism sector, which generated a large number of jobs." During the event, the Chargée d'Affaires, a.i. Dr. Rivera Gómez dialogued with the Deputy Director General of the Department of Protocol of the Swedish Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Mr. Hilding Lundkvist, about his frequent visits to several Mexican tourist destinations; he also pointed out "the cultural importance" of the film *Roma*, which in his opinion is the best film he has seen for quite some time; and especially, he said, that "it was admirable the role played by Yalitza Aparicio."

She gave them information on beach destinations in the different Mexican states, as well as on their gastronomy, museums, traditions, hotels and transportation options, among other topics. affairs, tourism and cooperation carried out by the Embassy of Mexico in Sweden, on February 18, the Chargée d'Affaires, a.i., Audrey Rivera Gómez received Ms. Andrea Herrera Sotelo, Commercial Advisor to the Embassy of Sweden in Mexico, and Mr. Nicki Khorram-Manesh, Head of Affairs for Mexico of the Department of the Americas at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, for a courtesy call. Also in attendance at the meeting were Mr. Aldo Jesús Viggiano Austria, Head of the Economic and Commercial area, and Mr. David Ruiz Coronado, from the area of Tourism and Economic-Commercial promotion of the Embassy.

The Chargée d'Affaires, a.i., Rivera Gómez thanked Mrs. Herrera Sotelo and Mr. Khorram-Manesh for their visit and answered all their questions regarding economic-commercial, investment, cultural and tourism promotion matters. They were told that Mexico has an economy that provides multiple investment opportunities in the manufacturing industry of household appliances, auto parts, aeronautics, public infrastructure and tourism. In addition, our country has increased its organic agricultural production (fruits and vegetables), agave

(Continued) honey (widely consumed in Sweden) and meat. They were also given a brief outline of tourism promotion strategies, not only in terms of beach and sun destinations, but also with regard to archaeological sites, Magical Towns, and cultural festivities that take place throughout the year in Mexico. It was also remarked that a Maya train will soon be built in this region and will reached tourist destinations in the area that are beyond the traditional ones of Playa del Carmen and Cancun. This train will travel through the states of Tabasco, Chiapas, Yucatan, Campeche and Quintana Roo, which includes Palenque, with two routes spanning 1,500 kilometers through the east and west coasts of the Yucatan Peninsula. It was also mentioned that opportunities have opened up for foreign investment not only in infrastructure as Maya train but also in the Northern and Southern part of the territory where are and will be free zones, less corporate taxes in those places, better opportunities for skilled workers, and open opportunities for young trainees paid by government.

The Swedish officials expressed their interest in strengthening contact and communication with this Embassy in order to strengthen collaboration on issues of mutual interest, among of which are: 1) Following up to the Memorandum of Understanding on Sustainable Mining Cooperation; 2) Renewable energy and smart cities; 3) Sustainable mobility, transportation and auto parts; 4) Digitalization, with a special emphasis on the Swedish national digital validation system known as Bank ID, which works as an electronic identification for government and banking institutions; 5) Corporate social responsibility and gender equality; and 6) the organization of the call for the National Youth Water Prize 2019, in collaboration with the Water Center for Latin America and the Caribbean of the Tecnológico de Monterrey, within the framework of World Water Week in Stockholm.

Mrs. Herrera Sotelo and Mr. Khorram-Manesh thanked the Chargée d'Affaires, a.i. Audrey Rivera and her working team for the courtesies extended to them, and reiterated their willingness to collaborate and remain in permanent communication with the Embassy in order to promote the issues that best contribute to the strengthening of the bilateral relationship.

Yucatan's best 12 attractions

1. Sea and tranquility in Isla Mujeres

The small city in the island has a street that goes all the way to the beach (Playa Norte), surrounded by restaurants and traditional clothing stores, tequila, chili, ceramics, Mexican hats and hammocks. Playa Norte is a beautiful beach with white sand, turquoise water and palm trees. The island's area is 8 kms and it is common to rent golf karts in order to explore it. Garrifon de Castillo offers the opportunity to practice scuba diving; Hostel Casa Sirena has a nice terrace where people can enjoy the sunset by the beach and the frozen margaritas.

2. Pastel colors in Valladolid.

Valladolid is a pastel colored city founded in 1543 which had a historical role in the Caste War (Guerra de Castas) in 1847, between the Mayan Indigenous and the European descendants, as well as in the 1910 Mexican Revolution.

Old colonial buildings can be found, along with a small market and restaurants with Yucatan's traditional food and San Bernardino de Siena Convent which was built by the Franciscan Missionaries in the XVI century. Zaci cenote is located in the middle of the city.

The city of Ek Balam is 25 kilómetros away from Valladolid, it has a high pyramid and 45 Mayan ruins. Web Page: www.visitmexico.com





3. Diving in Cozumel.

Cozumel is one of Mexico's biggest islands, surrounded by 56 coral reeves and famous for its great diving opportunities.

It is very common to rent a buggy to discover the island. During the weekends people dance to the live music on the beach next to the restaurants. To get to Punta Molas, a wilder area, one needs to calk, cycle or travel with a 4WD.

4. Swim in the crystal-clear water cenotes.

It is being said that there are more than 6,000 cenotes through the jungle of Yucatan's Peninsula, although just 2,400 have been registered. Cenotes were the only fresh water source for the Mayans. Nowadays, they are located under private areas and have stairs to go down to the water and sometimes showers and dressing rooms as well.

The Gran Cenote, outside Tulum es very popular, there are turtles and one can swim through the caves.



Akumal is a small municipality with a protected bay between Playa del Carmen and Tulum. The beach is 5 kilometers long and here one can rent diving equipment. A lot of tourists come from Cancún, Playa del Carmen and Tulum to swim with turtles, rays and other fish. Some restaurants and shops can also be found on the beach.

8. Mérida – a city full of culture.

Mérida was the culture capital in 2017. There are a lot of museums, theaters and galleries. The city was built on top of an old Mayan city which had five pyramids.

Here one can find some beautiful white limestone buildings around the heart of the city, traditional clothing shops, hammocks and hats. Surrounding Santa Lucía Plaza there are a lot of restaurants and on Thursdays one can enjoy shows with traditional songs and dances from Yucatan.

Paseo de Montejo and Santiago are other nice áreas to visit.

10. Sand streets in Holbox Island
