The International Children and Young People's Book Fair (FILIJ) was first celebrated in Mexico City in 1981 to promote reading among children



and young people. It also provides a space of editorial promotion and enables an encounter between authors, specialists, academics and general public.

This year, the FILIJ celebrates its 36<sup>th</sup> Edition with more than 140 exhibitors and 1, 500 cultural activities, including workshops, scenic shows, storytellers, music, movies, conferences and more. Germany will be the guest country, while Colima will be the guest state.
